"THE RETURN"

Rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. Joel 2:13 This Saturday we here at Trinity Lutheran Church of Southwest Florida we will be taking part (in our own small way) of a nationwide movement of Christians. It's called "The Return" and it's a day of repentance and prayer on behalf of our nation and the world. The main event will be in Washington DC, on the Mall before the Washington Monument as 1000s gather and remain over the course of the day for Divine inspiration and to pray for our country and all the world in the midst of all the problems that we are facing.
